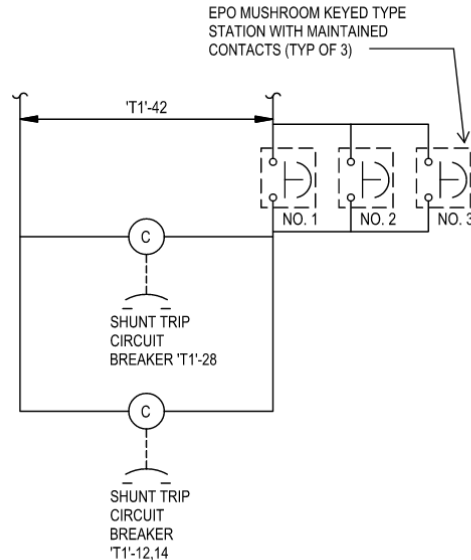


Question from Kyle Kunka Sea West Enterprises, Inc. on Thursday, Mar 20, 2025 at 08:56 AM PDT

However based off of job walk images it appears to that there are some large trees that may be in the area of work. Please advise if any trees are to be removed and if so, which ones. **Some trees and foliage will have to be removed, however removal must be kept to a minimum. GCC Staff will remove three large trees that are currently directly next to the platform area.**
2. Please confirm that the District will relocate and store tables/Chairs that are currently adjacent to the project area. **District will relocate the tables and chairs.**
3. Is weed abatement required for the area of work? **No**
4. Are any of the landscape plants to be salvaged? **No**
